APPLICATION PROCESS FOR K4 THROUGH 12TH GRADE

We appreciate your interest in Circle Christian School. This packet contains everything you need to complete the application process. Please note that one packet must be submitted for each student applicant.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

1. Circle Christian School is a private Christian organization that exists for the purpose of glorifying the Lord Jesus Christ by assisting Christian families in providing Godly education and academic excellence. Circle functions in a covenant relationship with the student's family. We require that at least one parent/guardian be a born again Christian, having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as his/her Savior.
2. The school expects exemplary behavior from its students. Applicants must have commendable behavioral records to be considered for admission.
3. *Circle Christian School does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, nationality, or ethnic origin.* However, because Circle is a distinctly Christian organization, the administration reserves the right to discriminate in areas of religious beliefs and affiliations.
4. Acceptance for enrollment in Circle is at the discretion of the Administration. It is based upon the satisfactory completion of all application requirements and a thorough review of all responses on the application forms.

STEP 1: APPLICATION

Turn in the following to the Admissions Office:

- Completed Student Application** - applications are accepted from February 6 - June 14, 2012.
- Application Fees** - All fees are non-refundable.
 - New Family Enrollment - \$75.00 - This fee is paid once per family per year, regardless of the number of applicants or returning students.
 - High School Fees (where applicable) - \$100.00 for grades 9-10, \$125.00 for grade 11, \$325.00 for grade 12
A summary of fees is included with this application.
- Birth certificate** - required for all student applicants.
- Immunization record** - HRS-680 form, all applicants must meet current state immunization guidelines. For the most current immunization requirements, see the Orange County Health Department Web site at <http://www.orchd.com/personalHealth/schoolHealth/enrollment/immunizationRecord/index.asp>
- Physician's form** - HRS-3040 form, all applicants must submit evidence of a school-entry health examination that was obtained within 12 months prior to the first day of school (August 15, 2012).

- Copy of **most recent Report Card** for students entering grades 1-9 **
- Copy of **Transcript** for students entering grades 10-12 and grade 9 as appropriate **

** Transfer students applying for enrollment in Circle are required to provide evidence of supporting documentation to determine academic status. Circle may require incoming students to take a standardized achievement test if the administration determines a student's records lack appropriate academic documentation.

- Test Score Reports** if available:
For grades 1-8, most recent standardized test including FCAT
For grades 9-12, PLAN, PSAT, ACT, SAT Reasoning Test, CPT, FCAT
- Homeschooling documentation**
If the student has been homeschooling, provide documentation for the prior three years.

STEP 2: ADMISSIONS

The Administrative Staff will prayerfully consider your child's application and communicate with you regarding the status of the application process.

STEP 3: ENROLLMENT

Upon acceptance to Circle Christian School, the following information must be completed and received by the Admissions Office before your student is officially enrolled. This documentation will be provided with your initial acceptance and will include the following. Other documents may also be required that are not listed here.

- Curriculum Declaration Form
- Enrollment Agreements and Covenants
- Forms specific to classes or programs in which student enrolls
- Request for Release of Records Form - transfer of records from prior school will be initiated at the close of the school year

STEP 4: MANDATORY MEETINGS

Once a student has been accepted to Circle Christian School, the final step in the enrollment process is attendance by at least one parent at all MANDATORY meetings. At least one parent must participate/attend the following meetings:

New Family Orientation - parents of all applicants in grades K-12 (this is an online event)

High School Workshops - parents and students in grades 8-12

Class and Program Orientations (for all upper and lower school classes offered by Circle) - parents and students in classes

All orientations will be held in August prior to the start of classes. Schedules and class information will be communicated via the weekly update.

PLEASE NOTE: Submission of a student application does not constitute acceptance into the school.

A WORD ABOUT K4 ENROLLMENT

Circle offers K4 students the opportunity to participate in the *Explorations* program. These students will not be enrolled as tuition-based students in Circle, but are accepted exclusively as provisional students in the *Explorations* program for one day per week. Students must be age four by September 1, 2012 in order to be considered for this program.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

Circle Christian School is a private Christian organization that exists for the purpose of glorifying the Lord Jesus Christ by assisting Christian families in providing Godly education and academic excellence. The school adheres to the following beliefs.

The Scriptures

We believe the Bible is the verbally inspired Word of God and is inerrant and infallible in its original writings. We believe it is the only and final authority for faith and conduct. (2 Timothy 3:16, 2 Peter 1:21)

God

We believe in one God who is Creator of all things by a direct act, infinitely perfect and eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (Genesis 1:1, John 10:30, 37, 38)

Jesus Christ

We believe by the miracle of the virgin birth that the Lord Jesus Christ, eternal Son of God, became man without ceasing to be God, in order to reveal God and to redeem man, that He died for our sins as a substitutionary sacrifice and rose bodily from the dead for our justification. We believe that He is now exalted at the right hand of God, that He is the Head of the Church, the Lord of the individual believer, that He is ministering as our Great High Priest and Advocate, and that we are awaiting His bodily return. (Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1:23, Luke 1:35, Hebrews 4:15, 7:25, 9:12, John 2:11, 11:25, Acts 1:11, Revelation 19:11-16)

Holy Spirit

We believe that the ministry of the Holy Spirit is to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ, and that He convicts the world of sin, regenerates the believing sinner, and baptizes him into the Body of Christ. We believe in the continuing ministry of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a Godly life which is the believer's holy calling. (Ephesians 5: 18, 4:1, 30, 1 Corinthians 3:16, 6:19, 20)

Sin

We believe that man was created in the image of God, but that he sinned, incurring not only physical death, but also spiritual death which is separation from God and inherited by every member of Adam's race. (Romans 5: 12-21)

Salvation

We believe that salvation is the free gift of God (neither merited nor secured in part or in whole by any virtue or work of man) to be received only by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, in whom all true believers have, as a present possession, the gift of eternal life, a perfect righteousness, sonship in the family of God, deliverance and security from all condemnation, every spiritual resource needed for life and godliness, and the divine guarantee that they shall never perish. (John 3:16-19, 5: 24, Romans 3:19, Ephesians 2: 8-19, Titus 3: 5, 6)

The Church

We believe that the true Church is composed of all who have been regenerated by the Holy Spirit and, thereby, constitutes a spiritual unity of believers, the Body of Christ. (Romans 8: 9, 1 Corinthians 12: 12-13, Galatians 3: 26-28)

Resurrection

We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost: those who are saved unto eternal life and those who are lost unto eternal damnation. (John 5: 28, 29)

COVENANT AND AGREEMENT

All Parents and Students (Grades 7-12) should read the following statements.

Circle Christian School is a private Christian organization that exists for the purpose of glorifying the Lord Jesus Christ by assisting Christian families in providing Godly education and academic excellence. The school adheres to the conviction that God has ordained that parents are primarily responsible for the education of their children. The school provides assistance and support to Christian parents who subscribe to this belief.

The two-fold goal of education is first to create within the student the desire to learn and, secondly, to give the child the ability to relate well to the world around him. The goal of Christian education is to accomplish this while acknowledging and applying the absolute standard of God's Word, the Bible. Because education is more than the mere gaining of academic knowledge, the school is committed to encouraging an environment in which families can more effectively cultivate the qualities of Character, Integrity, Responsibility, Creativity, Leadership, and Excellence in every facet of life.

Covenant

Circle is a covenant school that partners with students and parents. A covenant is a binding agreement between two parties. It signifies a solemn oath and sincere pledge of mutual respect and cooperation. Circle covenants to provide the best it can for its students and families through the programs and services it offers. Additionally, Circle pledges to do all it can to support each household in growing every student in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. Circle expects students and parents to covenant with the school by faithfully fulfilling all their responsibilities and complying with all school policies and procedures.

Disagreement

If for some reason parents and/or students become dissatisfied with Circle, all parties should seek to resolve the matter with the person(s) involved, rather than spreading criticism and negativism. (Matthew 18:15-17, 5:23-24). The parties should follow the process of resolving conflicts as outlined in the *Guidelines for Christian Conciliation* found at www.peacemaker.net.

Student Appearance and Behavior

In order to provide the assurance of a wholesome Christian atmosphere and to prevent any negative reflection on the school itself, Circle reserves the right to review any pertinent information, records, or circumstance of any applicant or enrolled individual or family. Circle reserves the right to ask for letters of referral or may contact former schools, etc. to request references regarding any individual or family. Any information gathered will be kept confidential. The Board of Directors reserves the right to take whatever steps it deems necessary toward any individual or family in order to insure that Circle's reputation and purpose are not hindered. Such action includes, but is not limited to, the denial of enrollment or removal from enrollment of any student or family. In the event of action by the Board of Directors, all student records will remain confidential and will be kept by Circle.

The school has a *Dress and Conduct Code*. Students are expected to exhibit an appearance and behavior that will be appropriate and in keeping with a Christian testimony in accordance with traditional Biblical standards. The Administration reserves the right to dismiss any student who fails to comply with these standards from an activity or class. Continued behavior in opposition to these standards may result in exclusion from school events.

PARENT’S STATEMENT OF SUPPORT

- I/We agree to support to the best of my ability the school’s entire program through prayer, time, and financial contributions, understanding that we are partners in the educational process.
- I/We will fully cooperate in the educational activities of Circle by doing my best to make Christian education effective in the lives of my children.
- I/We will pay all of my financial obligations to Circle on or before the date due. If I am ever unable to do so, I will notify the Business Office, giving a reasonable explanation for the delay and stating when payment will be made.
- I/We agree that Circle reserves the right to dismiss any student when either the parents/guardians or the student violates or does not cooperate with the policies of the school.
- I/We will be faithful to attend all required school meetings, as best as we can, noting that there may be financial penalties for failure to attend.
- I/We agree to file all reports and submissions in a timely manner as required by the school, noting that there may be financial penalties for failure to comply.
- If I/we become dissatisfied with Circle in any way, I will resolve the matter with the person(s) involved, rather than spreading criticism and negativism (Matthew 18:15-17, 5:23-24). I agree to follow the process of resolving conflicts as outlined in the *Guidelines for Christian Conciliation* found at www.peacemaker.net.
- I/We understand that Circle’s Biblical role is to work in conjunction with the household to mold students in Christ-like behavior. Understanding my role in the parent-school covenant/partnership, I agree to abstain from sexual immorality, including homosexual/bisexual orientation (I Thessalonians 4:3-8, Romans. 1:27, Galatians 5:19-23). I understand that Circle reserves the right to refuse the admission of an applicant, or to discontinue enrollment of a student.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND RELEASE

- I/We understand that Circle is a Christian organization as put forth in its *Statement of Faith* (page 9). I am in agreement with it and I am willing to have my child educated in accordance with it.
- I/We understand and agree that Circle shall not be responsible for the education of my child and that I am ultimately responsible. I further understand and agree that I am responsible to maintain the quality and scholastic standards of my homeschool.
- I/We understand that Circle must have all official school records and will function as the sole school of record while my child is enrolled in Circle.
- I/We understand and agree that I am responsible to provide appropriate care and oversight of my child at all times.
- I/We understand and agree that I must choose my own curriculum and that all curriculum, field trip, class/program, and activity costs are my responsibility. The curriculum used in Circle class/program offerings is designated by the administration.
- I/We understand and agree that I will meet and maintain all the requirements of and abide by the policies and procedures of Circle.
- I/We understand and agree that negligence of these responsibilities may result in a penalty fee or dismissal from Circle without refund, and that reinstatement is dependent upon reaffirmation to these standards, a favorable decision by the Board of Directors, and repayment of applicable fees.
- I/We understand and agree that I will meet all financial obligations that I incur related to services provided by Circle.
- I/We understand and agree that Circle reserves the right to review any pertinent information, records, or circumstance of any applicant or enrolled individual or family. This could include evaluation of the student/family status within the organization as it relates to finances, record keeping, and behavioral interactions. Circle reserves the right to ask for letters of referral or may contact former schools, etc. to request references regarding any individual or family and that Circle reserves the right to take whatever steps it deems necessary toward any individual or family in order to insure that Circle’s reputation and purpose are not hindered. I further agree that such action includes, but is not limited to, the denial of enrollment or removal from enrollment of any student or family.
- I/We release and hold harmless Circle from any and all claims for loss, damage, and/or injury of any nature to any person or property resulting from Circle's programs or activities.

- I/We, both individually and on behalf of my child agree to release and hold harmless Circle, its staff and employees, and the facility hosting a class or program from any liability in the event that any member of my family, including myself, incurs injury while attending activities related to this program.
- I/We hereby authorize the Circle staff to seek emergency medical assistance, if necessary, for my child. I understand that efforts will be made to contact me in case of an emergency.
- I/We understand that Circle offers a variety of optional classes/programs. I further understand that there are obligations and a fee structure associated with such classes/programs and, if I choose to enroll my child, I accept the terms and conditions and I agree to make the payments for the cost of said classes/programs where applicable.

Class and Student Covenant Codes

Attendance at Circle classes is based on a covenant relationship between Circle and the families and students it serves. The Covenant relationship is necessary to provide an excellent academic environment, guarantee the safety of its students, and maintain the integrity of the property on which it exists. The Covenant Code is intended to identify the boundaries and behavior expectations of students attending classes on Circle campuses as well as at Circle sponsored events. The Dress code is required on Circle campuses but modesty (as defined below is required at all Circle sponsored events.

The Academic Honor Code

Circle students must sign and agree to abide by the following honor code for all academic assignments:

“I have neither copied nor plagiarized another’s work on this assignment/test; nor have I seen anyone else copy or plagiarize another’s work.”

Any student caught breaking this code through plagiarism or copying of another’s work (a student, a computer, any published or unpublished work, written by someone else) is considered in violation of this code and will receive a zero for the work. If anyone sees or knows of someone else in violation of this code they are expected by this code to reveal the information known to them to a teacher, or administrator.

Cheating in any form is subject to immediate dismissal from campus. Probation status may be granted upon completion of a compensatory academic assignment. (The compensatory assignment may be granted according to the discretion of Campus Administration or the Student Honor Council.)

Students may be asked to sign the code on individual assignments at the discretion of the teacher.

The Attendance Code

Circle Students are required to attend all classes.

Excused absences: absences in which the parent contacts the site manager or the teacher in advance of the missed class. (This includes illness if the call is made before the class begins.) Make up work is the responsibility of the student) No more than 3 excused absences are allowed per semester.

Excused tardies: Parent or student calls the site phone in advance of the start time of the class to state that they are late and the reason. (Limit 3 per semester after which all are unexcused and fall into the category below.)

Sports or illness related absences are considered 1 day = 1 absence rather than 3 classes missed counting as 3 absences. (This is in the event of excused absences only) All teachers must be notified individually about absences.

Note that the excused status of absences and tardies is based on the place in time that notification of the absence or tardy is given to the teacher or the administrative staff. The notification must be made in advance of the start time of the late or missed class or it will be unexcused regardless of the reason.

Two unexcused absences or three unexcused tardiest (or the 4th tardy after 3 excused) will result in a probation/dismissal meeting. Students may be dismissed from the right to attend Circle classes after two unexcused absences. Probation may be extended to the student at the discretion of the administration.

Probation status is considered zero tolerance student status. The student on probation will be allowed to continue attending Circle Christian school classes on the condition that there are 0 unexcused absences, no more than 1 unexcused tardy and 0 behavior code violations for the remainder of the semester. Students on probation status will receive immediate dismissal (without reimbursement, or relief of financial obligation) from attending classes on a Circle campus for the semester/year after any unexcused absence, two unexcused tardiest, and/or one behavior code violation.

The Conduct Code

As a student of Circle Christian school I agree to treat my fellow students, teachers, administrators, with respect. I agree to take good care of the property where I attend class. I agree to abide by the Circle Covenant Code of Conduct. I realize that my status as a student at Circle is a privilege and based on my ability to comply with the Circle standards and codes defined below.

Only Circle Christian School Students, families and staff members are permitted on Circle Campuses on the days for which they are registered.

Students are not permitted to be on campus on days they do not have scheduled classes. (Exceptions must be approved by the campus administration. Guest students must sign into the Administration desk upon arrival.)

Circle students who are registered for consecutive classes and/or study hall may not leave campus at anytime between classes or during lunch alone, or with other students.

Students are permitted to leave with parents after signing out with the administration. (Exceptions must be excused by the Campus Administrator in the event of illness, emergency, or other unexpected event.)

Circle students remain in registered classes, study halls, in the lunchroom, or in halls of the campus building during classes, breaks and lunch periods.

Loitering in parking lots, other buildings, classrooms or offices, and/or sitting in cars is not permitted. (Unless accompanied by a parent.)

Students must leave campus promptly after the last registered class has been dismissed.

Driving on campus is a privilege. Students are expected to obey all traffic laws on campus. Reckless driving will not be tolerated. A student's right to drive on campus may be revoked for reckless driving, which includes failure to stop at stop signs in the parking lot.

Circle Students do not bring the following items on campus:

These items will be confiscated and returned only to the parent/guardian. Disciplinary action will be taken in accordance to the policy described below. Possession of fire arms, weapons, or illegal drugs will result in immediate dismissal as well as notification of the appropriate civil authorities.

Circle Students keep cell phones powered off in backpacks, purses or pockets while in the classroom. (Cell phones may not be in hands or sleeves, or powered on while in the classroom.) Cell phone use (including texting) is not permitted at any time during class time or in the classroom except when permission is granted by the administrative staff to contact parents. Study hall is considered class time and cell phone use is prohibited in the study hall. Teachers and staff reserve the right to collect cell phones for inappropriate usage and to turn them into the administration for parent pick-up at the end of the day. Cell phone use is allowed in the hallways, and lunchroom between class periods only. Cell phones must be powered off any place on campus during class periods.

Circle Students are allowed to use laptop computers provided a signed laptop covenant is on file with campus administration. (Circle is not responsible for the loss or damage to the student's computer.) Permission may be revoked at any time for violation of the campus covenant by viewing illicit material, movies, or pictures, playing music, or for any other activity considered by the campus staff to be disruptive to the campus environment.

Circle Students do not chew gum or have it in their mouths on any campus, at any time, for any reason.

Circle Students do not engage in Public Displays of Affection (PDA) on any campus grounds, parking lots and/or at all Circle sponsored events. PDA is defined as lingering embrace, kissing, hand holding, and/or touching another's torso below the neck and above the knees.

Circle Students treat each other with respect. Verbal, physical, mental, emotional, or sexual harassment and or abuse will not be tolerated at any time, or at any place, both on and/or off campus. This harassment/abuse code includes all Internet social networking sites. This is a zero tolerance code. Violators will be subject to immediate dismissal from Circle. *(At the discretion of the administration probation status may be granted upon completion of a compensatory assignment.)* Circle Christian school reserves the right to inform parents of observed inappropriate content on social media sites.

Circle Students may bring bottled water into class. No food or drink other than water is allowed unless part of a pre-planned class activity as arranged by the teacher or staff.

Circle Students use respectful language. Vulgar, obscene language, or curse words are not permitted on campus. Students heard using such language will be dismissed from class and given an unexcused absence.

Circle Students speak politely to teachers and staff. Arguing, talking back, and/or raised voices are not permitted. Students who are persistently disrespectful will be dismissed from class and will receive an unexcused absence.

Circle Students treat the campus facilities and property with respect and care. Vandalism, or destruction of property of any form will not be tolerated. Vandalism that results in permanent damage to the facility will result in immediate dismissal of the student. Cost of property restoration due to vandalism will be the responsibility of the student and/or guardian.

Circle Students do not use and abuse chemical or mind-altering substances. This includes legal and illegal substances, or any substance used in an unprescribed way. Students who arrive on campus, or to any school sponsored event that exhibit evidence of drug or chemical use, due to erratic behavior, physical evidence, or other

unusual behavior will be dismissed immediately from the campus or event. A drug test may be requested at the expense of the family for reinstatement to the class or activity. A Probation/Dismissal meeting will be scheduled. Verification of substance abuse will result in immediate dismissal from all campus classes and activities without reimbursement of financial obligations. Probationary status may be granted for the following semester after an appropriate and verified drug or alcohol treatment program has been completed.

Conduct Code violations will result in the following procedures:

- A. A code infraction will generate a Disciplinary Action Report that will be filed in the student's records and emailed to the administration, as well as the parent/guardian.
- B. The 3rd Disciplinary Action Report will result in a Probation/Dismissal meeting with a Circle administrator, the student's parents/guardian, and the student. The student will either be dismissed from campus classes without refund, or placed on zero tolerance probation status.
- C. Dismissal or probation will be at the discretion of the Circle Administrator assigned to the case.

Probation status is considered zero tolerance student status.

The student on probation will be allowed to continue attending Circle classes on the following conditions:

- A. 0 unexcused absences,
- B. No more than 1 unexcused tardy
- C. 0 behavior code violations for the remainder of the semester.
- D. Completion of a compensatory assignment levied at the discretion of the case administrator.

Violation of any of the above probation conditions may result in immediate dismissal (without reimbursement, or relief of financial obligation) of the student from attending classes on a Circle campus for the semester/year.

The Dress Code

Nametags must to be worn in clear view at all times while on campus.

An official Circle polo shirt or sweatshirt is the school uniform and is required to be worn on all campuses in order to attend class. (Polos should be long enough to cover waistband of jeans when sitting.)

A solid white or black undershirt or camisole (solid black or white with no markings, pictures or words), may be worn underneath the polo but must be tucked into the pants, shorts, or skirt. If the under shirt is seen beneath the polo, students will be asked to tuck in their shirt before being allowed to attend class.

Bottoms: Solid blue, black, white, or khaki colored jeans, pants, long walking or "bermuda" style shorts, or skirt may be worn. Skirts and shorts may be no shorter than 3" above the knee. (This includes slits in skirts.) All pants, jeans, shorts, or skirts must be hemmed (no frayed edges, tears, or holes). (Theatre students may wear the theatre uniform pants.)

Hair: natural color or style. Remove hats, sunglasses, and caps before entering the building.

Body: No visible piercings (other than ears for girls) or tattoos will be permitted in class. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings on campus and will be asked to remove earrings before being entering the classroom.

Shoes: Shoes are required for attendance. (No bare feet.)

Dress code violations will include but are not limited to the following:

Any shirt or pant that does not fit in the above defined category or:

A polo that is too short and waist, torso or undergarments are seen when sitting.

Any color garment under the polo.

Any garment showing below the polo.

Any colored or patterned pants, shorts or skirts.

Jeans that are excessively tight, or low cut so that undergarments show when sitting.

Jeans with frayed edges, holes, or tears.

Baggy pants, leggings or excessively tight pants, pajama pants, sweat or exercise pants.

Hair that is pink, blue, purple, maroon, yellow, green, or any other unnatural color determined at the discretion of the administration, as well as mohawks, or symbols shaved or cut into hair will not be permitted to attend class. Scarves, bandanas, or “do-rags” are not considered dress code and will be removed before the student is allowed into class.

Slippers or roller-type shoes.

Consequences of dress code violations:

Any student arriving on campus outside of dress code will not be allowed into class and will receive one of the following consequences:

1. Shirt violations: an appropriate fitting shirt from the office supply will be issued to the student and an unexcused tardy will be recorded. A \$20 fine will be added to the family account, for the cost of the shirt.
2. Pants violations: student will remain with administrative staff until parent arrives with an appropriate change of clothes, and an automatic unexcused tardy will be recorded. Students who miss class for more than 30 minutes will be given an unexcused absence.
3. Permanent hair violations will result in suspension or dismissal from class until hair is with-in dress code.

Off Campus Modesty Code for Circle Special Events:

Skirts or shirts no shorter than 4 inches above the knee. No cleavage or midriff showing.

Violators of the off campus modesty code will not be permitted to attend the event unless modifications are made in order to comply with the Modesty code.
